The Dursley Sculpture and Play Trail is set within the 27 acre Twinberrow Wood, off the A4135 heading from Dursley in Gloucestershire towards Tetbury.

At the top of Whiteway Hill turn sharp right.

Free limited roadside parking
after 800 metres.

The trail is on the right.

Since its launch in 2008 the Trail has successfully encouraged many local residents and visitors to appreciate Dursley's woodlands.

Twinberrow Wood is an important wildlife habitat which supports a diverse eco-system.

Dursley is situated in a wooded valley under the Cotswold escarpment and on the Cotswold Way, the long distance National Trail from Chipping Camden to Bath.

The countryside around Dursley also provides attractive walks including the footpaths over Stinchcombe Hill, Cam Peak and Cam Long Down, with wonderful views over the River Severn towards Wales and the Forest of Dean, the Malvern Hills and south towards the Seven Estuary and the Bristol area.



Local groups of varying abilities and ages (under 5s to over 90s) have helped to create individual works.
